



Likunda primary School is a boarding and day school located off Lunga Lunga Road near Kwale County Government offices within Mvindeneni village.

It is located in a serene environment which is conducive for learning and nurturing the different potential of the young learners.

Likunda primary is served by qualified, hardworking and fully dedicated staff and administration team who go beyond the normal call of duty to serve the clients. The staff serves under the leadership of a senior Headteacher-Florence Munke who is assisted by two deputies; Erick Omondi and Esther Luvindi.

In academics, Likunda School is a giant in quality performance, last year 2016 in KCPE examinations; we posted among the top candidates, five candidates who scored above 400 marks. Our quality performance comes as a result of our dedicated teachers, early syllabus coverage and candidates' special programmes such as morning prayers and staff adopting and guiding candidates in different families commonly known as the mentorship programme. This year we have thoroughly prepared our candidates for the national examinations which are forth coming and we believe they will beat the record set by their predecessors.

Due to this quality performance, Likunda school was recognized and selected as a pilot school by the Kenya Institute of Curriculum Development (KICD) in pre-primary 1 and 2. We were also recently selected by the KNEC to carry out the KCPE 2017 pre-Test.

Our kindergarten is an ultra-modern structure, very spacious and fully fitted with playing materials and toys promoting all round growth of the young children.

The local and international trips also play a vital role in our academic outcome, we visit different places within and out of the country and we have so far visited South Africa and Dubai and Thailand.

In the boarding section, the care and the welfare of the children is our priority. Our recently introduced routine dormitory checkups and inspections not only checks the cleanliness, neatness, unwanted items and personal grooming of our children but also instills the spirit of team work, participation and responsibility as the children take part in cleaning and taking care of their environment.

We value children who are all round and morally up right and for that reason we involve them in -all round training including communal work creative arts such as weaving, cooking, sewing among others.

The guiding and counseling department too plays an important role in talking to the children frequently contributing greatly to their emotional and psychological growth.

As we have moved to 2018, we say it's by God's grace.


